
## new youth worker starting september 2

Currently working for Scripture Union in the Isle of Man we are delighted that Hannah Elphick will arrive in September and will be working Granta Deanery for 60 hours a month. She will be helping Whittlesford, Sawston and Hinkledux churches run youth sessions on Sunday evenings and lead joint events.

She is employed by our partners, Cambridgeshire Youth For Christ (YFC), as a 'catalyst worker building links between young people and local churches.The rest of the week she will be based at their Cambridge centre as a Senior Youth Worker @ no40 and leading mentoring programmes in secondary schools.

## UPDATE FROM OUR PARTNERS CAMBRIDGESHIRE YOUTH FOR CHRIST



Open House Wellbeing is a new initiative of Cambridge and District Youth for Christ, but its origins go back a few years. The inception of this project goes back to when one of their senior youth workers, Jax, shared with our Centre Director a dream for a bespoke space for young people in the heart of Cambridge. A space for young people to hang out and for them to meet youth workers who genuinely love them and are interested in their lives.

No 40 is a cafe next to St Andrews Baptist in the centre of Cambridge for anyone aged 11-18. They can chat, play table football or Nintendo Switch or have a go at any number of board games and enjoy coffee and refreshments. Young people can stay for as long or as little as they want. Hang out with friends, make some new ones or chat with a youth worker.
